MANY EVENTS PLANNED IN 2011

LETTER TO MINISTER OF HEALTH

A letter has been sent to provincial Minister of Health Deb Mathews, asking her to intervene and suspend the Compass contract.

MEETING WITH JOHN GERRETSON MPP

A meeting will be held with the Hon. John Gerretson, Member of Provincial Parliament for Kingston and the Islands on January 12 to ask for his help in encouraging the Minister of Health to suspend the Compass contract.

PROTEST JANUARY 24

A protest will be held on January 24 at 1 p.m.in an effort to put pressure on the province to intervene.

PUBLIC MEETING

A second public meeting will be held on February 9, from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. to discuss legal challenges to the Compass contract. We believe that there are grounds under the province's procurement guidelines and environmental standards.
