Dear Local Presidents,

At our May 2012 Convention held in Windsor, Ontario, CUPE Ontario Convention made a historic equality amendment to Article 8 of the constitution to include a Diversity Vice President for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer (LGBTQ) Workers to the CUPE Ontario Executive Board.

To ensure representation on the Executive Board leading up to our next convention, the Executive Board has agreed to appoint on an interim basis one member to serve until the 2013 Convention. At the 2013 convention there will be a bi-election held for this position and the election will take place at the Pink Triangle Caucus.

Interested members are asked to submit a letter of interest along with both the nomination form and short questionnaire by **Thursday**, **October 4**, **2012**. Incomplete application forms will not be reviewed.

All submissions will be reviewed by the Officers who will consult with the Pink Triangle Committee (PTC) of CUPE Ontario prior to bringing forward a recommendation to the Executive Board for ratification the week of October 15, 2012.
