Qualitative questions for those working in the shelter/women's NGO:

- 1. What are the stories/experiences of women victims who were threatened/injured/attacked by a perpetrator that used arms how have police officials reacted when victims report the case or demand protection?
- 2. Do women victims usually have effective protection from violent perpetrators who have threatened/injured them by arms? If yes, by whom and how?
- 3. In your opinion, does informing the public and advocating on combating domestic violence help to change legislation:
 - a. On arms possession and acquisition
 - b. On protection of women from domestic violence?
