Demanded protection for workers organizing unions through multiple bills in legislature.
Jobs	 Huge tax giveaways to corporations used as failed job strategy. Cuts caused many public and private sector jobs lost due to cuts to public programs. 	 Phony, trumped-up " jobs plan" that would just reduce corporate taxes. Calls for cutting thousands of public sector jobs, including the loss of 10,000 jobs in school boards. Want whole-sale privatization and contracting out of public services – would hurt communities, devastate services and kill thousands of jobs. 	 Opposed to corporate tax give-aways. Forced cancellation of corporate tax reductions in 2012 budget. Won a youth employment strategy in 2013 budget. Advocates for good, full time jobs with decent wages and safe working conditions.
