Ontario has 5 key issues with our national union:

- 1. Representation and Decision making at the national level;
- 2. Resources;
- 3. Access to the Strike Fund;
- 4. Implementation of National Policy;
- 5. Equality.

Representation

Ontario has 40% of the membership

 Ontario's 4 seats represents 17% of the National Executive Board

 In contrast, CUPE Ontario holds 7 seats on the OFL Executive Board Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and PEI have combined membership of 39,067 compared to Ontario's 215,731 and they have 4 NEB seats the same as Ontario

 Saskatchewan and the Maritimes together have 5 seats and membership of 50,086

Access to the Strike Fund

 Until 2001 workers threatened by government legislation received support for strike averting campaigns. Not any longer.

 In 2005, Ontario hospital workers applied for a strike averting campaign-not being in collective bargaining, this request was denied. Strike averting campaigns are funded at 100%. Defense Fund campaigns are funded at 50%.

 Restricting strike-averting campaigns limits our fight against legislation threatening our contracts.

 Locals that don't have the legal right to strike can no longer take on a political strike against legislation
