## Summary of Changes to the CMOH Directive for Paramedic Services

The Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) issued a Directive for Paramedic Services to provide instructions to paramedics, first responders and employers concerning precautions and procedures related to Ebola virus disease (EVD).

A revised version of the Directive was issued on December 2, 2014. The fundamental guidance in the directive remains unchanged.

Minor changes to the Directive include:

- a re-ordering of the document sections for improved access to contents
- additional detail regarding the ministry's existing bypass agreement approval process
- clarifying the use of designated ambulances for confirmed EVD cases only
- correcting references / language regarding port of entry service
- correction to PPE legging length for use with gowns vs. one piece protective suites
- additional detail has been added to many of the fundamental components of the directive, such as donning and doffing, waste management and other sections
- clarifying the approval of PAPR equipment as an alternative PPE solution
- clarifying the role of isolated drivers and pilots and respective PPE requirements
- formatting of section headers has been changed to comply with accessibility requirements
- clarifying the practice of cleaning gloved hands
- clarifying the permitted number of paramedics used for transport of confirmed EVD patients.

Noteworthy changes to the Directive include:

- a definition section has been introduced
- guidance for designated paramedic services and designated ambulance deployment and preparation has been added as an appendix to the directive (Appendix 2)
- allowing for more judgement by the paramedic service regarding the choice of facial and eye protection combinations
- removal of the ministry EVD Screening Tool for Paramedic Services from the directive (
  the screening tool will be managed and distributed by the EHSB to paramedic services and ambulance communication centres)
- acknowledgement of a containment vessel suitable and approved for use in Ornge operations
