Components of the biennial convention will address the serious impacts of Ford's plunder of programs essential to union retirees across the province.

Engaging retirees in building the resistance to the Ford attack on Ontario's working class builds key support for our local, sectoral and Ontario-wide campaigns.

Our 2019 convention resolution asked us to expand our retirees network and actively promote setting up retiree committees at locals and at district councils. Our success so far is modest, with only 2 district councils and a handful of locals having designated retiree representatives and committees. There are however some impressive examples of retiree representation being

These are well worth promoting but support from our officers, each executive board member and Staff Reps is essential if we are to duplicate these initiatives across Ontario.
