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SSWCC 2024 Conference Workshop Summaries

We are offering the workshops on Friday, April 5th, 2024, and there will be a morning session from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm and afternoon session from 1:30 pm - 4:30 pm. All 10 workshops will be available for morning and repeat in the afternoon session.

Workshop 1 Title:

SLS-What Stewards need to know about bargaining

Workshop 1 Summary:

Learn about the different steps in the bargaining process, the responsibilities of different activists throughout bargaining, and the role during bargaining.

Workshop 2 Title:

Anti-harassment and Bystander training

Workshop 2 Summary:

When we are disrespected in our union, or when harm, harassment, and discrimination happen we are unsafe. We would not accept it from our supervisors and managers at work, and it is not ok in our union space. When we witness others being harmed, oppressed or injured, we can intervene in safe and effective ways before, during, or after a harassing or violent situation.

In this 3-hour workshop, learn and practice how to intervene.

Workshop 3 Title:

SLS-Ally Skills for Stewards

Workshop 3 Summary:

Effective stewards are champions for human rights and equality. Explore what it means to be an ally, and ways that stewards can step up as allies in the workplace and the union.

Workshop 4 Title:

LET-Conflict Ready Executives

Workshop 4 Summary:

In this workshop, participants will explore:

- The value of conflict for effective groups
- How our beliefs about conflict shape how we respond
- The kinds of conflict executives struggle with
- Productive ways to resolve conflict on an executive

Workshop 5 Title:

LET-Bylaw Essentials

Workshop 5 Summary:

Good bylaws are an essential component of a well-functioning local. In this workshop, you will learn the principles of good bylaws and how to make sure they are in compliance with CUPE's national constitution. We'll also look at how clear language bylaws help our members get involved in the work of the union.

Workshop 6 Title:

SLS-Psychologically Safe workplace

Workshop 6 Summary:

What is a psychologically healthy and safe workplace? Learn to identify the psychosocial hazards in a workplace, and the tools we have to address them.

Workshop 7 Title:

HS-Workload and overwork

Workshop 7 Summary:

As employers pull back resources, they expect workers to do more with less. This module will examine workload, the cause and effects of overwork, and strategies to overcome the ever increasing workload that is damaging not just our health at work, but the relationship we have outside of work.

Workshop 8 Title:

Preparing for Retirement – What you and every member should know?

Workshop 8 Summary:

Whether you are preparing to retire in the next few years or still have a few more decades to go before retiring, this workshop will identify and highlight some of the real-life challenges and obstacles of retiring. Workshop instructors from CUPE Ontario Retirees Network will provide lived experience, knowledge and wisdom on how to navigate towards and through retirement and share things they wish they knew before they retired. This is one workshop you don't want to miss!

Workshop 9 Title:

Pay Equity, Joint Job Evaluation and Maintenance in the Workplace – Making it happen!

Workshop 9 Summary:

This workshop will provide participants with the fundamentals and walkthrough of Pay Equity and Joint Job Evaluation process, as well as Pay Equity Maintenance.

What is Pay Equity and Joint Job Evaluation and how does it benefit members and the workplace? Why Pay Equity Maintenance is important? and How can our Local implement the Pay Equity and Pay Equity Maintenance process in the workplace.

If your local does not have a Pay Equity plan or if your local does have a Pay Equity plan but it has not been maintained in several years, then this workshop is for you.

Workshop 10 Title:

Membership Communication – How to Create and Use Newsletters to Build Your Local

Workshop 10 Summary:

Communication is a pillar to building a strong membership and Local. We recognize that every local is at different stages when it comes to membership communication strategies. There are many options available to communicate with our memberships from e-blasts, call drops and text messages to websites, social media and newsletters.

This workshop will focus on newsletters, but will answer questions on deploying other digital communications tools. It will be broad in scope so it doesn't matter what stage of membership communications your Local is at. And it will be hands-on, equipping delegates to create and send a newsletter via MailChimp. To accomplish this, delegates are encouraged to bring a laptop and sign up for a **free** MailChimp account prior to the workshop (<u>https://mailchimp.com/</u>). Members who are in an executive position at their Local are also encouraged to bring their Local's contact list.

This workshop is a must for any delegate looking at improving and developing their communication with their membership.
