HEALTH CARE WORKERS COORDINATING COMMITTEE 2024 CONFERENCE

DELEGATES AND VOTING

- a) Accredited delegates are recognized as members who attend from their own local union and that the local union has paid the registration.
- b) There shall be no restriction on the number of attendees from each local union, but all attendees must be accredited delegates as in a) above.
- c) Notwithstanding the above, for purposes of voting on issues pertaining to the business of the HCWCC, the following shall be how voting delegates are selected from each local union:

Number of Local Members	Voting Delegates
1 to 100	2
101 to 250	3
251 to 400	4
for each additional 150 members	1 additional delegate
District Council	1

d) Locals, which represent both Health Care and Non-Health Care members, shall be allowed voting delegates based only on the number of workers in the health care sector in their local membership using the above formula.

WORKSHOP & PRESENTATION DESCRIPTIONS

1. SLS - Growing our Mobilizing Power (3hrs)

Stewards can play a key role when the union needs to mobilize our members – whether it's to support the bargaining committee or stop the employer's attempt to contract out our work. Learn basic mobilization theory and explore how stewards can tackle workplace problems in ways that engage more members and build the union's power.

2. SLS - Ally Skills for Stewards (3hrs)

Effective stewards are champions for human rights and equality. Explore what it means to be an ally, and ways that stewards can step up as allies in the workplace and the union. ***

3. SLS - Representing gender and sexually diverse members (3hrs)

Homophobia, biphobia, and transphobia play out in our workplaces, locals, and communities. Learn how to challenge these kinds of discrimination, and respectfully represent gender and sexually diverse members in your workplace.

4. SLS - Creating Harassment-Free Workplaces (3hrs)

Learn how to recognize harassment, educate members about harassment, and represent members who are involved in harassment complaints.

5. LET - Duty of Fair Representation (3hrs)

Learn about your local's duty to represent the members in your union, the legal requirements of fair representation and how it applies to your collective agreement and other laws covering your workplace.

6. BARG - Mobilizing for Bargaining (6hrs)

In this workshop, members of local Mobilization Committees look at effective ways to engage members before bargaining begins, and throughout the bargaining process.

7. Anti-Harassment and Bystander Training (3hrs)

When we are disrespected in our union, or when harm, harassment, and discrimination happen we are unsafe. We would not accept it from our supervisors and managers at work, and it is not ok in our union space. When we witness others being harmed, oppressed or injured, we can intervene in safe and effective ways before, during, or after a harassing or violent situation.

8. SLS - Challenging racism in the workplace (3hrs)

This workshop covers what racism looks like in the workplace, and your role as a steward in challenging it.

9. Communication Tools (3hrs)

This workshop covers communications tools and strategies that locals will be able to utilize amongst the membership which can improve their local communications infrastructure.

10. SLS – Solidarity with Indigenous (3hrs)

Learn about Canada's history of colonialism, engage in some myth-busting, and explore ways you can build solidarity with Indigenous workers and support reconciliation in the workplace.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING WORKSHOPS

- Choose two (2) workshops: one for the morning session and one for the afternoon session. If you select "BARG – Mobilizing for Bargaining", you only need to pick one workshop, as it consists of both the morning and afternoon sessions.
- Participants must register for these workshops. Those who do not pre-register will be assigned to workshops based on availability.
- Workshops can be selected after conference registration is completed.
