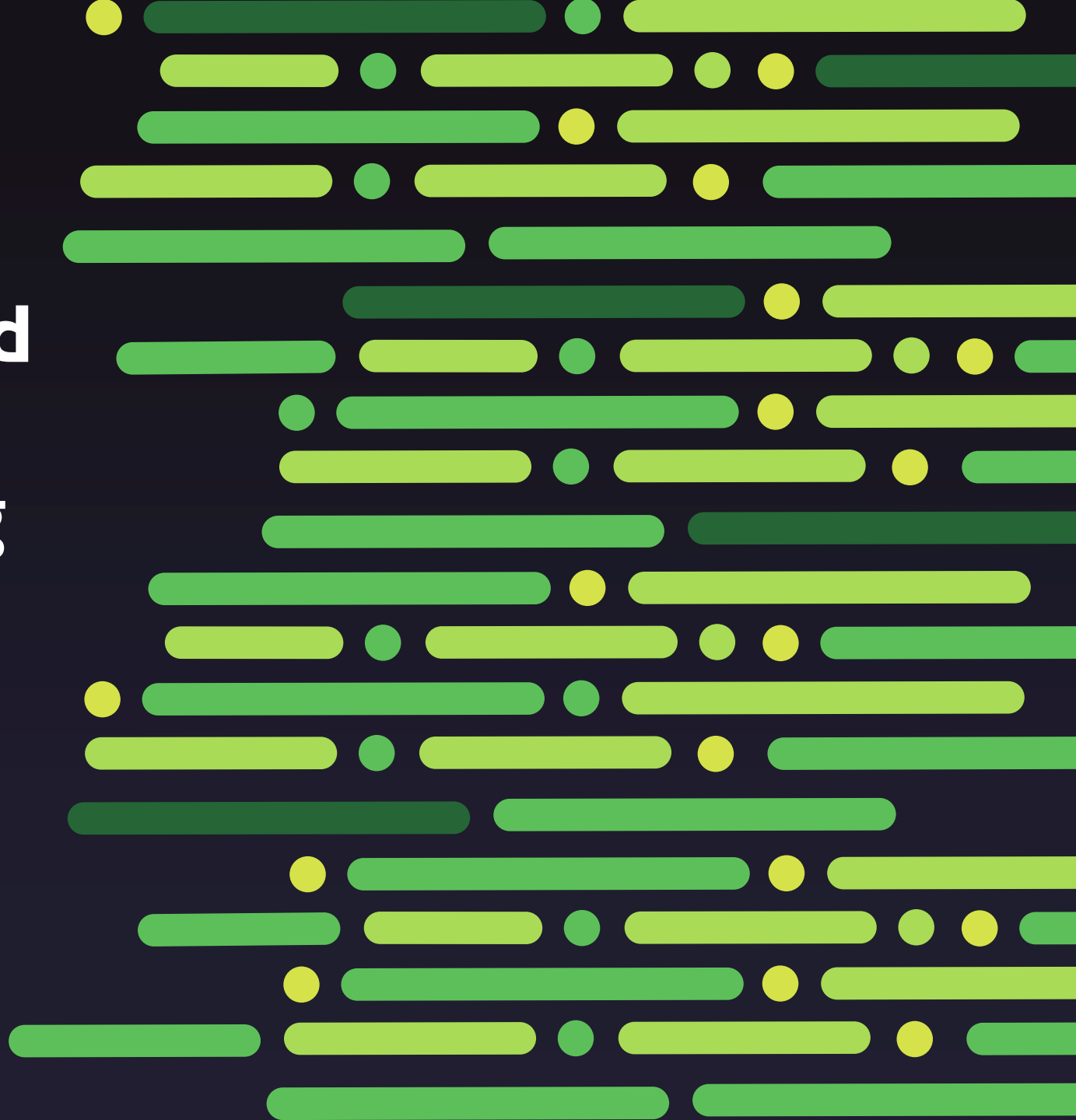


Ontario School Board Trustees & Government Funding

HAMILTON

September, 2025



Methodology

The survey was conducted with 2,000 Ontario residents from September 11 to 13, 2025. A random sample of panelists were invited to complete the survey from a set of partner panels based on the Lucid exchange platform. These partners are typically double opt-in survey panels, blended to manage out potential skews in the data from a single source.

The data in this report is exclusively among those living in **Hamilton**. The margin of error for a comparable probability-based random sample of the same size is +/- 7.45%, 19 times out of 20.

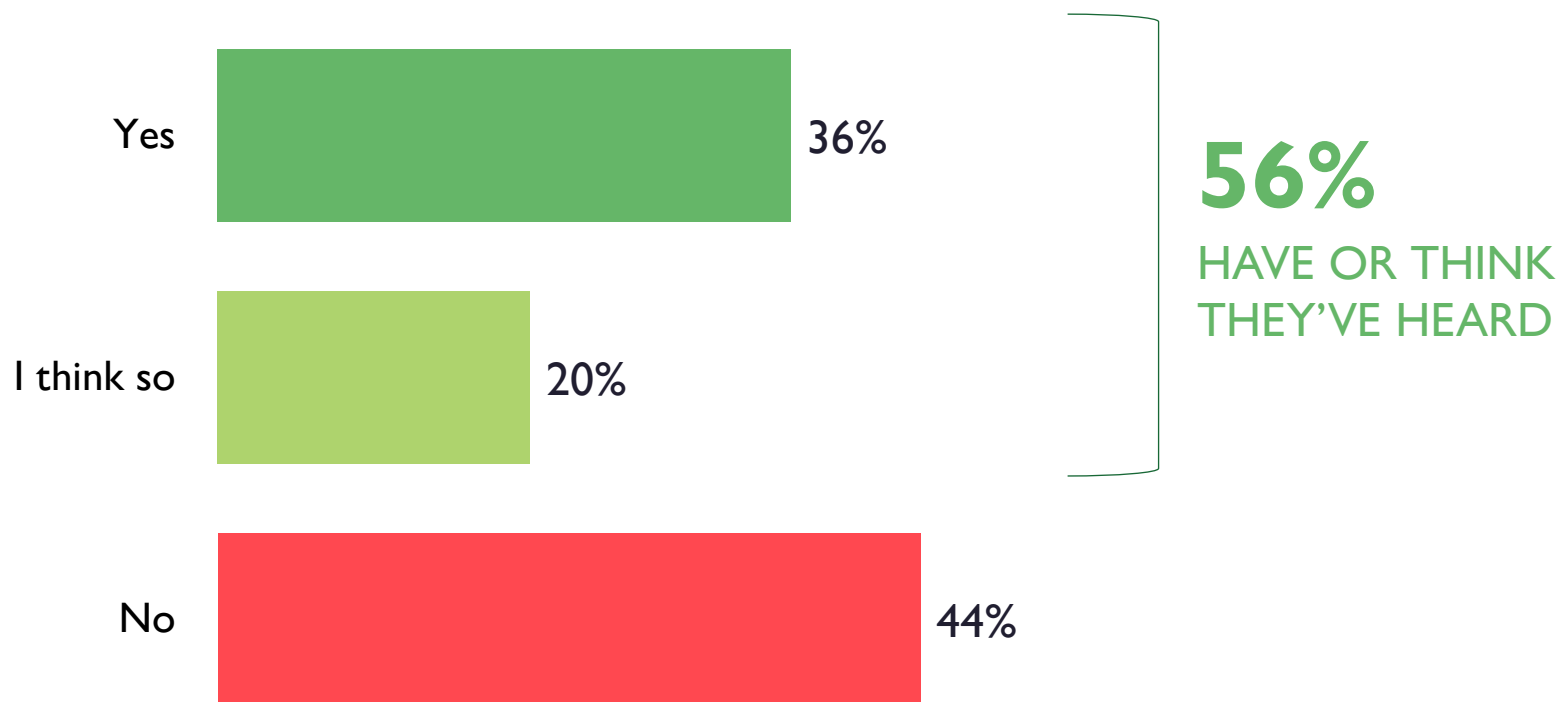
The data were weighted according to census data to ensure that the sample matched Canada's population according to age, gender, and region. Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding

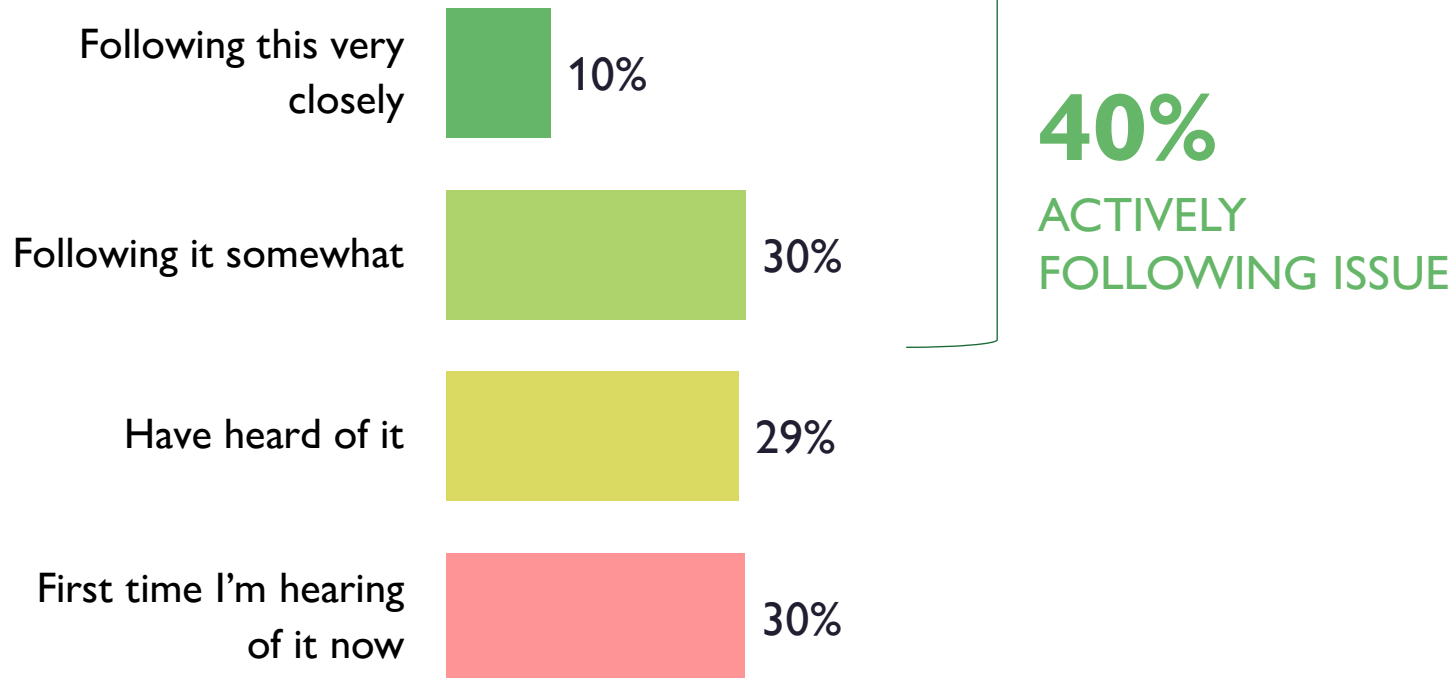


...How closely have you been following this issue?*

***Preamble text:** In Ontario, public schools are organized into school boards. Each board is responsible for managing schools in its area, including decisions about budgets, staffing, and programs. School boards are overseen by elected trustees, who are chosen by local voters during municipal elections. Trustees are meant to represent the views of parents and community members, set policies, and hold the board managers (e.g. directors of education, superintendents) accountable for how schools are run. The Ontario government, through the Ministry of Education, sets province-wide funding levels and standards, while school boards and trustees make decisions about how that funding is used locally.

Some Ford government figures (led by Education Minister Paul Calandra) have discussed changes that could include eliminating elected school board trustees, and potentially restructuring or eliminating school boards...

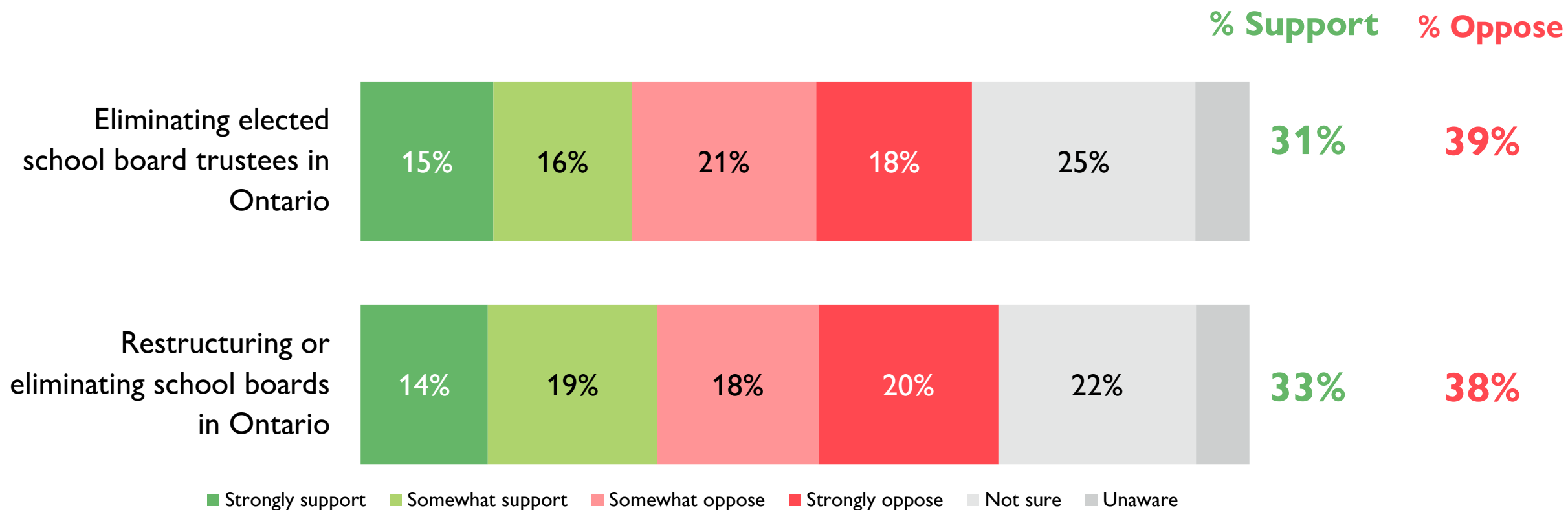

Only 1 in 3 Support Changes – Most Oppose or Unsure



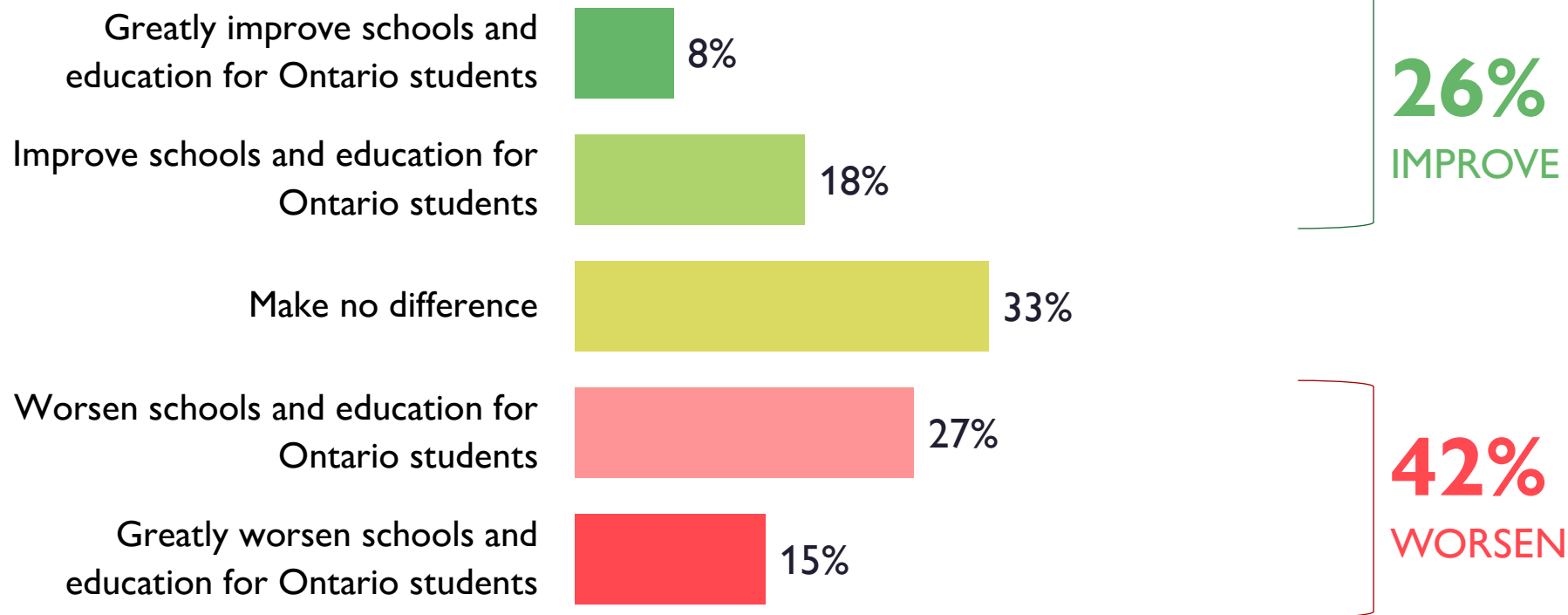

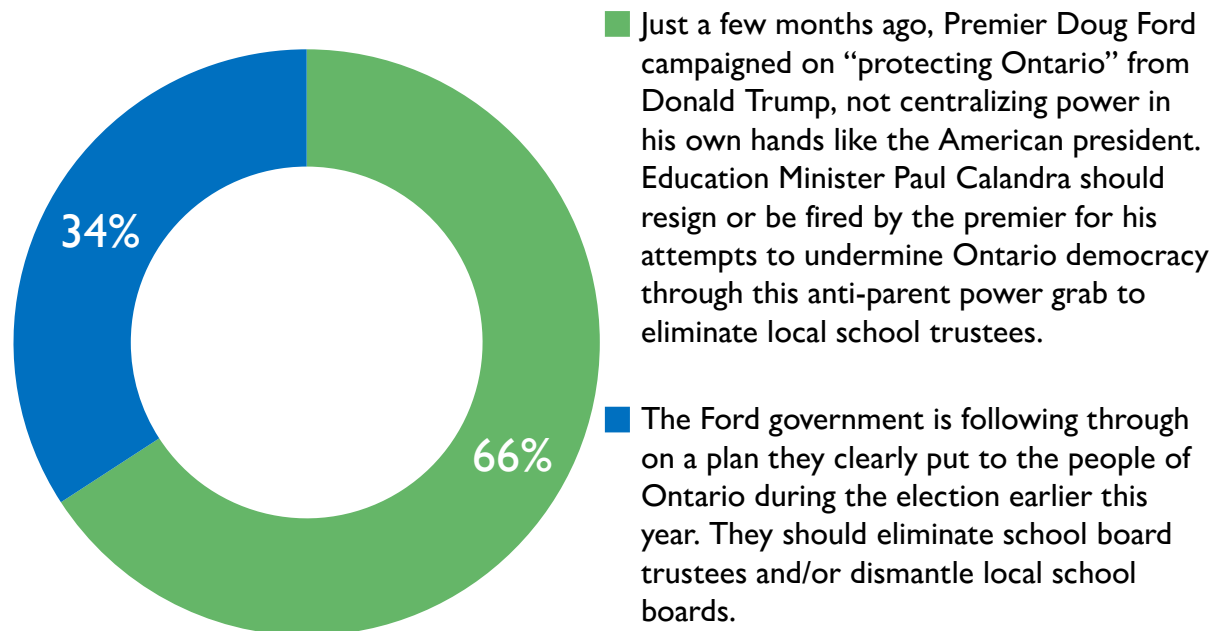

Which of the following is closer to your own view?

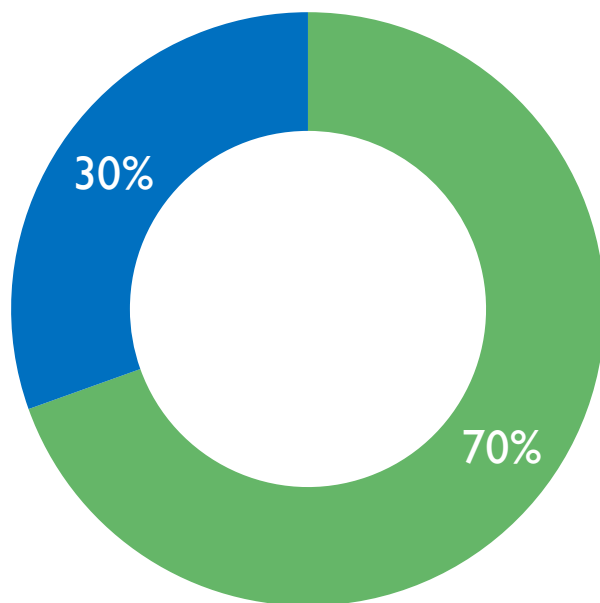

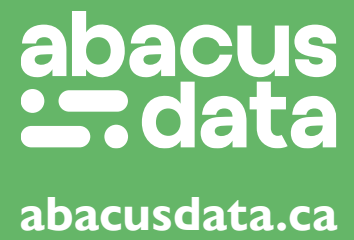
Which of the following is closer to your own view?
