This is part of best practice –

What proportion of these cases do you			
think were from domestic violence?			
Many women will not and do not say			
that their injuries are a result of			
domestic violence – it is down to the			
health professionals to make a			
judgement in many cases.			

Qualitative questions:

- 1. What are the stories / experiences of women victims who were abused/injured/attacked by arms how have police officials reacted when reporting the case or demanding protection?
- 2. Do health workers report the police injuries made by firearm? Are they obliged by a law to do that? Very good and important question.
